<p>Practise your phase 3 and phase 5 sounds and tricky words. Have a sound or word hunt around your house or garden. Who can collect the most? You might also like to play phonics bingo or snap.</p>	<p>Use a cotton bud dipped in lemon juice to write a message on paper. Let the juice dry and then heat the message with a hair dryer. Your secret message should appear when heated up.</p>	<p>Practise counting money. Count up groups of 2ps, 5ps and 10ps. Can you count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s and not just in 1s?</p>	<p>Collect a selection of fruits. Are they all the same? Do you know what they look like inside? Look inside—what patterns do you notice? Plant some of the seeds and watch to see if they grow!</p>
<p>Choose your favourite book read it to a member of your family. Would you recommend it to a friend?</p>	<p>Imagine your favourite toy came to life! What would a day in their life look like? Where would they go and what would they get up to? What would their favourite meals be, and what would their voice sound like?</p>	<p>Say the pairs of numbers that make 10. When confident move onto 20. Play funky mummy: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/Search.aspx?q=funky%20mummy</p>	<p>Use an empty egg box as a treasure box to collect things from the garden. Can you collect lots of things of the same colour? What about different smells? How many different things can you collect?</p>

Visit the library to take part too. https://summerreadingchallenge.org.uk/</p>	<p>Keep a diary (or a secret diary) and write about the different things you get up to over the summer holidays! You might like to draw pictures to go with your writing as well.</p>	<p>Draw around your foot onto some paper and cut it out. Use your paper foot to find out how many 'feet' tall are you? What else can you measure?</p>	<p>Use an old cardboard box to cut out a shape of an animal. Hold it in front of a light, like your bedside light or a torch. Is the shadow bigger or smaller than the cardboard animal? Try and make the biggest and smallest shadows that you can. How did you do this?</p>
