## Baddow Hall Infant School Newsletter

Dear Families,

In reception this week, the children have been comparing quantities, using the phrases 'more than' or 'less than'. Having a secure understanding of how to compare quantities, means children will be better able to order numbers in Key Stage 1. Children can reinforce this learning at home, [BBC bitesize](#) have some activities for reception children on their website.



In year 1 art lessons, children have been creating fossil sculptures using clay. The children looked at the work of Hamish Mackie for inspiration. The children learnt how to manipulate the clay by pressing and pinching. Today the children have painted their sculptures.

Within their music lessons, year 2 children are embedding their understanding of musical vocabulary. They are listening and responding to different styles of music and discussing the dynamics, texture and structure of the piece. The children have also been playing the glockenspiels.

### Reporting absence

If your child will be absent from school you must call or email by **9.30am**. When calling or emailing, please include the following information:

- Child's first and last name
- Class number (or name of teacher)
- Reason for absence

Please note that if your child has been sick or has diarrhea, they must remain off school for **48 hours** from the last instance. This is to help prevent the spread of potential bugs.

Please ensure that your child does not bring any products into school containing nuts, including cereal bars, cakes and sandwich fillings.

**This includes chocolate spread as we cannot be sure that it is not Nutella.**  
We have staff and children with severe nut allergies.


