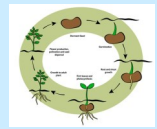


In reception, children are continuing with their reading of Julia Donaldson stories. This week 'What the Ladybird Heard' is their focus story. During the first read, children were asked to predict what will happen next. Julia Donaldson has written many books that are suitable to read at home. Perhaps take a visit to the Great Baddow library to get some more of her books to read at home.



Year 1 children have been estimating and measuring length in centimetres for their maths lessons. This is a skill that children can practise at home, using rulers or measuring tapes.

Year 2 children are learning about the different stages of the life cycle of a plant and learning the names of different parts of the plant. This is also something that can be revisited at home, when exploring the outdoors. Knowledge of plants and animals features throughout the science curriculum up to GCSE, it is important for children to embed their knowledge and understanding at each stage of their learning.



Congratulations to all the children that ran the London mini marathon on Saturday. It was great to share your experience with everyone in our assembly and see your medals. Some of the children are aspiring to run the actual marathon when they are 18, however, one was a definite 'no way'. Well done everyone on your achievement, there are some photographs from the event on the last page of the newsletter.

Reporting absence—reminder

If your child will be absent from school you must **call or email the office** rather than the class teacher by **9.30am**. When calling or emailing, please include the following information:

- **Child's first and last name**
- **Class number (or name of teacher)**
- **Reason for absence**

Please note that if your child has been sick or has had diarrhea, they must remain off school for **48 hours** from the last instance. This is to help prevent the spread of potential bugs.

Please ensure that your child does not bring any products into school containing nuts, including cereal bars, cakes and sandwich fillings.

This includes chocolate spread as we cannot be sure that it is not Nutella.

We have staff and children with severe nut allergies.

Pre-order your child's school dinners

Meals for the **week beginning 11th May must be booked by midnight on Tuesday 5th May.**

If a meal is not booked, reminders are not always sent out so parents will be phoned and asked to provide their child with a packed lunch. If a meal has been booked and they arrive with a packed lunch they will be given the meal and the packed lunch will come home with them.



Breakfast Club

If you are needing a child care solution in the mornings due to needing to get to work, we run a fantastic Breakfast Club which caters for infant & junior children and starts at 7.30am. If you would like to register your child, please contact the infant office.

Breakfast Club sessions can be booked online via Parent Pay at any time, but no later than 7.15am on the day. (The serving of food finishes at 8.15am).
