Our School Day

7.30am Our Breakfast Club opens for Infant and Junior School children.

8.40am Children are welcomed into the classroom by their teachers for registration.

8.45am Please make sure that your child is in school no later than 8.45am when the school day officially begins.

8.55am The children attend assembly in the hall.

9.10am Learning time.

During the morning the children will have a break and snack time. A piece of fruit or vegetable is provided to each child by the school.

12.00pm Children enjoy a healthy lunch and play with their friends. School meals are cooked in our kitchen daily and a varied menu is offered throughout the year. School meals for infant children are free.

1.05pm Afternoon registration and then learning time.

3.15pm Following an afternoon of learning, the school day ends at 3.15pm.

Our after school clubs provide extended opportunities for learning. We also provide child care facilities until 6.00pm through the YMCA.

School Uniform

Our school uniform providers offer an electronic ordering system and uniform can be delivered directly to your home. Alternatively, you may visit the local shop and purchase items directly from stock.

Girls

- White blouse or polo shirt (school logo or plain)
- Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers
- Blue & white checked dress for summer
- Royal blue cardigan, jumper or fleece (school logo or plain)
- Black shoes (no sandals or trainers) Lace up shoes if child able to tie laces independently
- BHIS book bag (one small keyring permitted)
- White socks or grey tights
- 1 small hair accessory in school colour
- Stud earrings are permitted (please see jewellery guidance)

Boys

- White shirt or polo shirt (school logo or plain)
- Grey trousers or shorts
- Royal blue jumper or fleece (school logo or plain)
- Black shoes (no sandals or trainers) Lace up shoes if child able to tie laces independently
- BHIS book bag (one small keyring permitted)
- Grey socks



P.E.

- White crew neck t-shirt (school logo or plain)
- Royal blue shorts
- Black trainers with Velcro fastening
- Navy/Black Sweatshirt and jogging bottoms for outdoor PE

Children should wear their PE kit to school on their designated PE day

Please ensure all items are clearly named.

Nail varnish and coloured hair dye are not permitted.

Jewellery

Following guidelines given by Health and Safety at Essex County Council, children are not permitted to wear any type of jewellery for sporting activities. This will include after school clubs. Earrings must be removed prior to each activity and as we are not permitted to remove them, you will need to ensure that you are aware of the days that the class has PE or if your child is attending a sports related after school club and remove earrings before coming to school.

It is no longer permissible to use tape, even on newly pierced ears, and in consequence we would encourage you to only have your child's ears pierced at the beginning of the summer break. This should allow the healing process to complete before returning to school and ensure that children do not miss out on valuable PE lessons. Whilst we appreciate that children may wish to wear watches to school this is only appropriate if they are able to tell the time. We would suggest that children are encouraged to learn to tell the time before wearing a watch to school. Children are not permitted to wear smart watches.

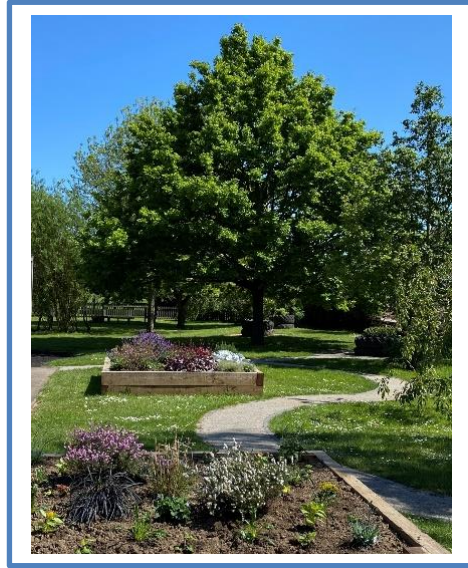
Health and Safety

Availability of Information

Admission Arrangements

Admission arrangements are in accordance with the Education Authority Policy as set out in the booklet entitled Primary Education in Essex. Applications are made online via Essex County Council. It is parent's responsibility to check the website for the opening and closing dates for applications.

Prospective parents are encouraged to attend a school tour, dates are published on our website. Please contact the school office to arrange this. Tour dates are published on our website and take place during the Autumn Term.

We offer a comprehensive induction program before your child starts school including the opportunity for a home visit, a meeting for parents/carers, story sessions and even an opportunity to sample food from the school dinner menu.

At the beginning of the summer term we encourage all new parents to attend an induction meeting where you will find all the information you need to ensure your child has a happy start to school life.

Moving On

We have strong links with our partner Junior School and have a comprehensive transition program. The children meet their junior teacher and spend time in their new classroom before leaving the infant school. The children look forward to the next stage of their school life, feeling confident and happy.

By the end of their time in school, pupils are well prepared for the move to junior school.

All children with special educational needs at Baddow Hall have access to a balanced and broad curriculum.
