Easter Card

Make an Easter card. You could even include a letter with it.

Gardening

Plant some flowers or other plants in the garden and look after them in the coming weeks. Get the children to help with jobs around the garden.

Salt dough

Follow a simple salt dough recipe to make different ornaments. You can put these in the oven and then decorate them. Make lots of different objects or a family piece.

Wanted posted

Make a wanted poster for the Easter Bunny and display these around the house. Add as much detail and description as you can along with a picture.

Spring Hunt

Take a walk outside and spot the following signs of Spring: flowers, insects, birds, squirrels, leaves, a flower bud and a bird's nest. You could take photos of them or draw them. If you collect some items you could make a nature picture.

Scavenger hunt

Make a list of objects that children have to find on their walk. Staying indoors? Write down each letter of the alphabet and get the children to find an object in the house beginning with each letter.

Make a book

Make a book. Write your own story and then illustrate it. It can be based around Easter or use your own imagination to make your own up. Feel free to send these to us to read! This can also be done on Purple Mash.

Egg and spoon race

Get the whole family involved in an egg and spoon race! Don't forget to hard boil them first! You could also decorate them before or after your race. Try out different activities to make your own sports day. It can be up to the children to organise.

Rolling eggs experiment

You need: hard boiled eggs, a stopwatch/timer, a ramp and different things to wrap the eggs in e.g. bubble wrap/kitchen roll/fabric. Your task is to see how quickly the eggs travel down the ramp when they are covered in different materials.

Easter picnic

Have an Easter picnic with the family. You could make some of the things you will eat at the picnic, make decorations such as name cards and think of some games to play once you've all eaten. You could also sing some of our Easter songs!

Plastic is fantastic!

Find an object made from plastic and re-use it for something else. For example turn a used water bottle into a plant pot. Remember to ask an adult to help you cut the plastic.
