This week has been very busy with children out on local area visits.

Children in reception visited Great Baddow Library on Monday, as part of their learning about the area in which they live and the people who help us. ### Reporting absence

If your child will be absent from school you must call or email by 9.30am. When calling or emailing, please ensure that you include the following information:

- Child's first and last name
- Class number (or name of teacher)

Please note that if your child has been sick or has diarrhea, they must remain off school for **48 hours** from the last instance. This is to help prevent the spread of potential bugs.

Please ensure that your child does not bring any products into school containing nuts, including cereal bars, cakes and sandwich fillings.

This includes chocolate spread as we cannot be sure that it is not Nutella. We have staff and children with severe nut allergies.

Meals for the <u>week beginning 1st December</u> must be booked <u>by</u> <u>midnight on Tuesday 25th November 2025.</u>

If a meal is not booked, reminders are not sent out so parents will be phoned and asked to provide their child with a packed lunch.

#### **Textiles Recycling**

We have a textiles recycling box beside the bike shelter. If you are having a sort out of clothes, shoes, bedding, curtains etc, please use this bin to recycle them. This helps to raise funds for the school. A poster of which items can and can't be recycled can be found on the window of our main entrance and also on the side of the recycling box. (They do not accept school uniform items with logo's on it). If you have any school logo uniform that you no longer need, please give to the PSA rather than place in the recycle box. The PSA regularly hold pre-loved uniform sales so this really helps. (you can hand pre-loved uniform into the office and we will pass this onto the PSA).
