Reception Homework – Friday 14th November

Please complete this week's homework by taking pictures for Tapestry. You can use the paper in your homework book if you would like. Please give it the title: Homework 14.11.2025.

Activity:

This week, we would like you to compare groups of objects using the words 'more than' and 'fewer than'. Choose two of your favourite soft cuddly toys. Ask your grown-up to give a collection of the same object to one of the cuddly toys and collection of the same object to the other cuddly toy (e.g. pencils, fruit, toy cars). Can you tell your grown-up which cuddly toy has more and which cuddly toy has fewer? Can you explain how you know?

Please note: We use the word fewer when we are talking about quantities, rather than less than when we are talking about numbers, so for this homework your child needs to be saying 'fewer than'.

Ideas for parents:

- Give sets containing different numbers of the same objects. There could be a small difference (for example one toy gets 3 red pencils and the other toy gets 1 orange pencil).
- Encourage your child to use the language 'more than' and 'fewer than'.
- Support your child with saying the sentence: _____ has more than _____. For example, Teddy has more than Monkey.
- Support your child with saying how they know (e.g. 3 is more than 1).
